“Building an Integrated Intelligence Community”

FY 2011 Call for MINTWG Submissions

The Director of National Intelligence’s Multi-Intelligence Working Group (MINTWG) is pleased to announce a Call for Submissions for its Intelligence Community Experiment Program. In FY 2011, the MINTWG will invest approximately \$5 Million to fund a number of proposals that adhere to this year’s theme: *“Building an Integrated Intelligence Community.”* The MINTWG encourages your organization to propose new, agile, and innovative strategies to combat ever-changing global issues. We challenge the IC to bring forth ideas promoting Community-wide integration while preserving America’s values.

The MINTWG, chaired by Mr. John Miller (DDNI/A/ATT), promotes concepts and ideas that integrate intelligence across multiple disciplines and multiple agencies within the Intelligence Community. The Working Group has representation from CIA, DHS, DIA, FBI, NGA, NRO, and NSA. These organizations, and over forty other government organizations, have either led or participated in multi-intelligence experiments since 2001.

Approved MINTWG funding will be used to administer and conduct experiments, as well as accommodate certain costs arising specifically from experimentation. Agencies will fund the cost of prototypes, the use of their own personnel, and existing infrastructure and facilities.

For the FY11 experiment year, the MINTWG is encouraging responses from the IC that are directed at addressing the goals and objectives of the ODNI Analytic Transformation program mission statement: “Enable high quality, timely, actionable intelligence for customers by enabling collaboration and connecting expertise, wherever it may reside.”

Organizations wishing to submit a nomination should consult the August 2009 National Intelligence Strategy and address one of the objectives stated. In addition, stronger preference will be given to those nominations addressing activities related to improving one or more of the following focus areas:

- **Information Discovery** (ICD 501) – Integrate and promote the IC to responsibly share and collaborate in order to protect the homeland against threats and to improve analysis of information passed to decision makers.

- **Analytic Transformation** – Enable high quality, timely, actionable intelligence for customers by promoting collaboration and connecting expertise, wherever it may reside.
- **Improved Infrastructure** – Introduce enterprise applications and architectures that improve IC business processes by creating a more integrated and agile community.

Experiments that are proposed to involve use of the ODNI's Single Integrated Test Environment (SITE) facilities will also receive bonus points during evaluation.

In addition, nominations submitted for consideration must meet the following minimum criteria:

- Must include two or more intelligence disciplines.
- Must involve participation of two or more IC agencies or organizations.
- Must demonstrate a new and innovative idea.
- Must follow the MINTWG nomination template.
- Must have a signed statement of concurrence from the executive agency OGC.
- Must be submitted with signatures from management at participating organizations/agencies, demonstrating the commitment of resources.
- Must be submitted by a U.S. Government employee.

The MINTWG will accept nominations until 16 September 2010. Nominations are to be submitted through your agency's MINTWG Representative or the MINTWG Chair. Upon request, the MINTWG, through the MISE Team, will provide assistance to teams wishing to develop a nomination package. The MINTWG encourages all interested organizations to contact the MISE Team with any questions or concerns about the process.

The FY11 MINTWG Experiment Program

The MINTWG is dedicated to receiving and evaluating well developed nominations. To this end, there will be several nomination-building seminars held for instruction and guidance. Nomination teams are encouraged to attend. Participation in the seminars will provide an opportunity for one-on-one discussions with the MISE team. Please contact the MISE to arrange attendance at the seminars.

The MINTWG also is offering *ad hoc* assistance to the nomination teams (support from the MISE team) during the nomination development period. Nomination teams are encouraged to contact the MISE to arrange for assistance.

Nomination teams should submit proposals to their MINTWG representative early in the development process for review. At a minimum, participants are strongly encouraged to submit draft nominations to their MINTWG representative (or the MINTWG Chair) NLT 4 September (two weeks prior to the due date).

All participants must ensure that their completed nominations are approved, in writing, by their agency's Office of General Counsel, prior to submission on 17 September.

Selection and notification is anticipated by 19 November 2010. Funding is anticipated to be disbursed early in FY 2011. Awarded experiments are intended to complete their activities and produce a results report by June 2012.
